ORDINANCE FOR ADMISSION TO (TWO YEAR) POST GRADUATE (M.A.) COURSE IN MUSIC (VOCAL/INSTRUMENTAL)

PRELIMINARY:

The Post Graduate Degree Course in Music shall be offered in the Dept. of Music, Magadh Mahila College. Patna under direct control and supervision of Patna University. It shall be designated as Master of Arts Course in Music and shall be abbreviated as M.A. (Music). The Post Graduate Course in Music will be offered both in Vocal and Instrumental Music.

2. QUALIFICATION FOR ADMISSION TO POST GRADUATE COURSE IN MUSIC:

A candidate seeking admission to Post Graduate Course in Music must possess:-

- (a) A three years' Bachelor's Degree in Music from a recognized University, with at least 45% marks obtained in Music at the Bachelor's examination, or
- (b) He/She must be holding a three year's Bachelor's Degree in Arts. Science or Commerce with atleast 45% marks at the Bachelor's level and, in addition, should have a Prabhakar degree in Music from Prayag Sangeet Samiti, Allahabad, or Visharada degree in Music from Pracheen Kala Kendra. Chandigarh or any other degree recognized equivalent thereto by Patna University.

3. PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION TO POST GRADUATE COURSE IN MUSIC:

- 3.1 Admission to 1st year P.G. course in Music shall be held on the basis of an entrance test to be organised each year by the University. No candidate will be admitted to the course unless he/she has secured a proper place in the merit list prepared on the basis of the entrance test. The entrance test will be held in both theoretical and practical aspects of Music. The theoretical test will be held for 80 marks: of which 30 marks will be earmarked for objective type of questions drawn from general studies and environment and remaining 50 marks will be set aside for subjective/objective type of questions to be asked from subjects/areas pertaining to Music. A practical performance test too will be taken for 20 marks. The merit list will be prepared by adding marks obtained by the candidates in both the parts of the entrance test.
- 3.2 Admission to N.R.I. students shall be made on the basis of the same Entrance test as in 3.1 above. However, a separate list of N.R.I. candidates will be prepared based on the result of the said entrance examination and N.R.I. students will be admitted accordingly from that list.
- 3.3 No person shall be admitted to the course who has not applied for admission within the notified period or who, being selected for admission does not get himself/herself enrolled within the specified time, excepting such situations where the delay has been condoned by the Vice-Chancellor.

RESERVATION:

The reservation of seats for the course shall be as per reservation rules of the Govt. of Bihar.

NUMBER OF SEATS FOR THE COURSE:

The number of seats in each of the two streams of the course i.e. Vocal and Instrumental Music shall not exceed 20, including 5 seats in each stream reserved for N.R.I. candidates. In case NRI seats remain vacant due to any reason, the same will be filled by resident Indian students

6. FEE STRUCTURE:

- Each candidate shall have to pay Rs. 500/- (rupees five hundred) as fee for purchase of Admission Form and for other expenses to be incurred in connection, with the conduct of the entrance test.
- The fee structure for M.A. (Music) course shall be as is stated in sub-clause (A) and (B) below:



Note:- Fee from NRI students will be accepted in dollars only. 6.3 The fee structure may be revised from time to time by the Vice-Chancellor in consultation with the Course Co-ordinator and the Finance Committee after obtaining Chancellor's approval.

7. MISCELLANEOUS:

The Academic Council of the University may introduce teaching of Post Graduate Course in Music in any other educational Institution of Patna University on the same terms and conditions as are contained in this Ordinance.

REGULATIONS FOR M.A. (MUSIC) COURSE



GENERAL

- 1.1 These regulations shall be called as regulations for M.A. Course in Music of Patna University.
- 1.2 These regulations shall come into force from the Academic year 2009-2010 or from such date as may be notified by the University.

2. DURATION OF M.A. (MUSIC) COURSE:

- The University shall offer M.A. course in Music, leading to award of Master's Degree in Music, abbreviated as M.A. (Music).
- 2.2 The duration of M.A. (Music) course shall be of two academic years. However, no student will be permitted to continue in M.A. (Music) course beyond a maximum period of 4 years from the date of his/her first admission. In other words, it will be necessary for him/her to pass both the parts of the examination in a maximum period of four years; after which his/her name shall be struck off from the University rolls.

3. ATTENDENCE:

Every Student will have to attend at least 75% of classes, both in theoretical and practical papers separately, before he/she is permitted to appear in any part of the examination, provided that a short fall in attendance up to 15% may be condoned by the Vice-Chancellor only on medical grounds.

4. EXAMINATION:

- 4.1 The academic programme of the University in Music shall be based on the system of annual examination, which means that the University will conduct annual examination at the end of each Part/Year of the course. The two term-end examinations at the end of each year/part will be known as:
 - (a) M.A. (Music) Part (1) Examination, and
 - (b) M.A. (Music) Part (II) Examination.
- 4.2 Every student shall have to pass separately in each paper (both Theory & Practical) of each Part of the examination before he/she is promoted to next Part/Year.
- 4.3 In order to pass in M.A. (Music) examination of any part, a student shall have to secure at least 33% of marks in each theory paper and atleast 45% of marks in each practical paper.
- 4.4 If candidate has cleared one part of the examination in full, he/she will not be permitted to reappear in the same part of the examination to improve nis/her marks.

AWARD OF DIVISIONS:

No division will be awarded at the end of Part (I) of the examination. A candidate who has passed in Part (I) of the examination, shall be simply promoted to Part (II) of the course. When he/she has also passed Part (II) of the examination, he/she shall be awarded division as per following stipulation, taking the aggregate of the marks obtained by him/her in both the parts of the examination, as below:

5.1 75% and above

Less than 75% but not less then 60%

5.3 45% or more but less than 60%

5.4 Less than 45%

5.5 Less than 35%

First division with distinction

First division

2nd division

3rd division

AWARD OF DEGREE:

Each successful candidate, on completion of the course, shall be awarded a degree of M.A. (Music) in the format as prescribed by Patna University.
