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

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# AMENDMENT PROPOSAL IN REGULATIONS FOR MASTER OF LIBRARY AND INFORMATION SCIENCE (MLIS) REPLACING ENTIRE EXISTING PROVISIONS

- Every student shall undergo a certified study extending to an academic year consisting of two semesters, each semester of six months duration.
- Admission to MLIS course is open to candidates who have passed Bachelor examination in the Faculty of Science, Social science, Humanities, Commerce, Education, law followed by Bachelor degree in Library and Information Science conducted by an University established or incorporated by law.
- Lectures shall not exceed two third of the time schedule. Seminars, Group discussion and Problem oriented discussion shall be held regularly.
- MLIS course shall consist of nine papers each carrying 100 marks. The syllabus of five
  papers shall be covered in Semester One whereas of four papers in Semester Two.
  The breakup of the syllabus will be as follows:-

- The examination for the degree in Master of Library and Information Science (MLIS) shall consists of two parts namely MLIS Semester one & MLIS Semester two examination.
  - 1 There shall be University examination at the end of each semester.
  - To pass in the first semester University examination, one must score at least 40% marks in each paper separately and minimum 45% in total.
  - The result of second semester examination shall be declared on the basis of totality of student's performance in both semester taken together.
- The candidates may be examined for the award of MLIS degree provided he/she fulfills the following conditions:
  - a) Any registered student of the University having requisite eligibility may after completion of each semester with a minimum of 75% attendance in theory & practical papers separately will be admitted to MLIS Semester one and MLIS semester two examination respectively.

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- b) The performance of the student in each paper will be assessed on the basis of a Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) of 30 marks and written examination of 70 marks conducted towards the end of each semester, called the End Semester Evaluation (ESE).
- c) The components of CIA are as follows:

Two mid semester written tests of one hour duration -15 marks (7.5X2)

10 marks ii) Seminar / Power Point Presentation

05 marks iii) Punctuality and conduct

Total 30 marks

Candidates shall be declared to have passed in a semester examination provided :-7.

He / She secured at least 45% marks in each paper at ESE & CIA examination separately.

He / She ha secured at least 45% marks in the aggregate of all the papers of b) the semester system.

A candidate, who has failed in not more than two papers, shall be promoted to next 8. semester. However, he / she will have to clear those paper with the same semester system whichever is available.

The final result of the promoted students will be declared only after he / she

has cleared all papers.

The sent up candidates of semester one will be promoted in semester two class and 9. they will carry on their CIA marks secured during semester one provided it is at least 40%, the minimum pass marks. If a candidate fails to secure 40% marks in one or more paper of the CIA examination of any semester, he/she will be allowed once in each semester for re-examination after deposition of a fee of Rs. 100 per paper in the department.

In semester one there shall be examination of five theoretical papers (MLIS 01-05) 10. whereas in semester two it will be of two theoretical paper (MLIS 06-07), one practical paper (MLIS-08) and viva voce on the project report under paper (MLIS-09). The duration of the semester examinations in MLIS papers 01-08 will be of three hours duration. In theoretical papers (01-07) out of ten questions a candidate will be required to answer five questions including question No. 1 which is compulsory. The division of 100 marks of paper MLIS-09 (project report) will be in the following manner:

-30 marks Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) - 30 marks Evaluation of the project - 40 marks Viva voce on the project report

In the prescribed examination a candidate shall be required to pass both in theoretical 11. as well as in the practical papers.

Candidate will be required to have successfully cleared all the papers for the award of 12. degree/diploma.

As soon as possible after the MLIS second semester examination, the University shall 13. publish the list of successful candidates in order of merit in the manner stated below on the basis of aggregate of total marks secured in semester one and two examination taken together:-

Candidates securing 75% and above marks will be placed in the First Class with distinction.

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- b) Candidates securing 60% to 74% marks shall be placed in the First Class.
- c) Candidates securing 45% to 59% marks shall be place in the Second Class.
- 14. Each successful candidate of MLIS examination shall receive a diploma/certificate in duly approved prescribed Performa specifying the subject and the class in which he/she was placed.
- A candidate securing first position in First Class shall be awarded with a gold medal.
- Name of promoted students shall not be included in the merit list of successful students.
- 17. No student shall be permitted to be registered as student in other course leading to a diploma or degree during the academic year of his/her study for this MLIS Course.

18. This regulation shall come in to effect from the academic session 2014-15.

AMENDMENT PROPOSAL IN ORDINANCE FOR MASTER OF LIBRARY AND INFORMATION SEIENCE (MLIS) REPLACING ENTIRE EXISTING PROVISIONS

# DURATION OF THE COURSE

This course shall be of one academic year duration consisting of two semesters, each semester of six month duration. Semester one will run during July to December where as semester two will run during January to June every year. There will be at least 18 to 20 weeks of teaching per Semester.

# 2. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

- i) Bachelors degree from an University established and incorporated by law followed by
- ii) Bachelors degree in Library and Information science from a recognized University. Candidates must have 50% marks for general Category students and at 45% marks for S.C.& S.T. students to be eligible for admission.

# NUMBER OF SEATS

Sanctioned seats will be 45 (Forty five) each year. Subject to formal approval of State Government.

### 4. SELECTION

(I) The selection of candidate for admission shall be made in order of merit. Merit list shall be prepared on the basis of open competition followed by viva-vice.

#### FEE STRUCTRE

Fee structure per student for the complete course (Semester one and Semester two) shall be the following:-

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- 6. The fee structure may be reviewed every third year by the Vice-Chancellor in consultation with the Director of the course. However, the approval of the Chancellor will be must.
- Reservation of seats will be provided as per the State Government rules.
- The master of Library and Information Science subject shall be placed in the faculty of Social Science.
- No applicant shall be admitted, who has not applied for admission within the notified time, or who on being selected for admission, does not get himself enrolled within the specified time.
- 10. No applicant shall be admitted, who in the opinion of the Vice Chancellor should not be admitted in this course in the best interest of the University.

11. This ordinance shall come into effect from the academic session 2014-2015

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
